## Club President

What you can do for your club

- Guide, support and advise other officers and committee members on club matters
- Attend the AGM and committee meetings
- Encourage and support players by attending all team games (or ensure someone represents you)
- Make sure visiting club officials are made welcome at all home games
- Organise former player reunions
- Make sure your Club Dinner is well-organised
- Set in place a succession plan for key club officials
- Hand over to the next President as smoothly as possible

The role
As the figurehead of the club, you will:

- Be the welcoming face of the club
- Set an example that influences the way the club is perceived
- Represent the club at internal and external functions
- Work alongside the Club Chairperson to help smooth the administration
- Provide impartial advice based on your broad experience

Ideally, you'll need to be:

- A charismatic personality
- Confident and good at communicating
- Tactful and discreet
- Well-versed in the running of the club
- Analytical and good at solving problems
- Familiar with good business practices and procedures

What you'll get out of it:
This is a highly respected, important and very social role, with the opportunity to network and build important relationships both within the club, the wider community and working environments. As President, you'll be the focal point of the club off the pitch and a valuable asset in promoting the club to a wide range of people to widen its use.

How much time it will take up:
About 6 hours a week, mainly at weekends.
